As we reflect on our accomplishments in 2023, we are excited to share our revised mission statement that signifies our ongoing commitment to funeral service:

Lifting up grieving communities by investing in people and programs that strengthen funeral service.

This change embodies our dedication to the people and programs in funeral service and the hard work and support that is needed in serving the communities we call home. We believe that this updated mission will guide us more effectively in our work and inspire greater impact in the years to come.

The highlights of this year's report demonstrate the progress we've made and the lives we've touched:

- More than 250 people received an academic and or professional development scholarship from the Foundation in 2023, enabling them to obtain their mortuary science degree, increase their learning and contributions to the funeral service profession while minimizing debt.
- With the added generosity of Legacy.com, The Messenger Co., the NFDA and many more - we were able to permanently endow the Foundation's Crisis Response Fund, which stands ready to support communities facing emergent situations.
- The annual Funeral Service Foundation Golf Classic, held at Top Golf, Las Vegas, hosted more than 150 people and raised a record \$170,000 in support of the foundation's resources and programs.
- The Foundation lost one of our Board Members in 2023, Todd Van Beck. He
 was a friend, a colleague, an educator, and mentor to so many. At our Annual
 Donor Reception, we honored and memorialized Todd as the Foundation's 2023
 Distinguished Service Award winner. Additionally, due to the generosity of our
 stakeholders we were able to create and permanently endow the Todd Van Beck
 Academic Scholarship.

It's clear that our collective efforts can make a real difference. None of this would be possible without your generous support and belief in our mission.



CRISIS RESPONSE FUND

The Funeral Service Foundation Crisis Response Fund was created in 2004 as a response to funeral professionals' desire to support relief



efforts in the aftermath of the devastating tsunami, and to offer funding in the wake of regional, national, or international

The Funeral Service Foundation first

provided catalytic support to the Hurricane Katrina Memorial in New Orleans in 2008, giving a final resting place to 86 bodies that remained unclaimed after the storm, over a third of them unidentified.

More recently, the Fund awarded more than \$500,000 in COVID-19 relief grants, \$10,000 in direct support to funeral homes following Hurricane Ida in Louisiana in 2021, and \$50,000 in support of the Children's Bereavement Center in Uvalde, Texas in 2022.

Following each of these crises, the Foundation's generous donors stepped right up to donate to the cause. As it should be, funds raised were directly distributed in support of those affected. But with each crisis, once the funds were raised and given out, the Foundation waited until the next emergent crisis to turn on its fundraising apparatus and learn how it could be of help.

In late summer 2023, when tragic wildfires consumed Lahaina in Maui, the Foundation was

inspired to give a more permanent structure to the Crisis Response Fund. The Foundation's Board of Trustees approved a grant of \$40,000 earmarked for the Crisis Response Fund with additional gifts of \$25,000 from the National Funeral Directors Association (NFDA); \$25,000 from Legacy.com; and \$10,000 from The Messenger Co.

These total funds of \$100,000 were matched through the end of 2023 allowing the Foundation to permanently endow the Fund – enabling it to transform and uplift grieving communities through needed gifts of resources and support, including memorialization, and urgent services and supplies for funeral professionals.

While the opportunity to raise funds as crises emerge will always be a helpful tool to garner support and then direct funds to where they're needed most, endowing the Fund permanently will allow for its long-term investment and growth in between these critical times of need.

"The Foundation's Board of Trustees, our donors and partners want to assure that assistance is available to those who are doing the difficult work of helping a devastated community.

THE CHILDREN'S BEREAVEMENT CENTER OF SOUTH TEXAS

The Foundation ran its first printing of "When a Child Dies" on the same morning as the tragic events in Uvalde, Texas in May 2022.



The Foundation's Crisis Response Fund quickly mobilized and sent copies of the new resource straight to Uvalde and then awarded \$50,000,

including \$10,000 in matching funds from The Messenger Co., to the Children's Bereavement Center of South Texas.

Through the Center, community members who are struggling to cope with residual trauma and grief receive services including grief counseling, grief camps, and support groups. All services are provided at no cost to grieving families.


